

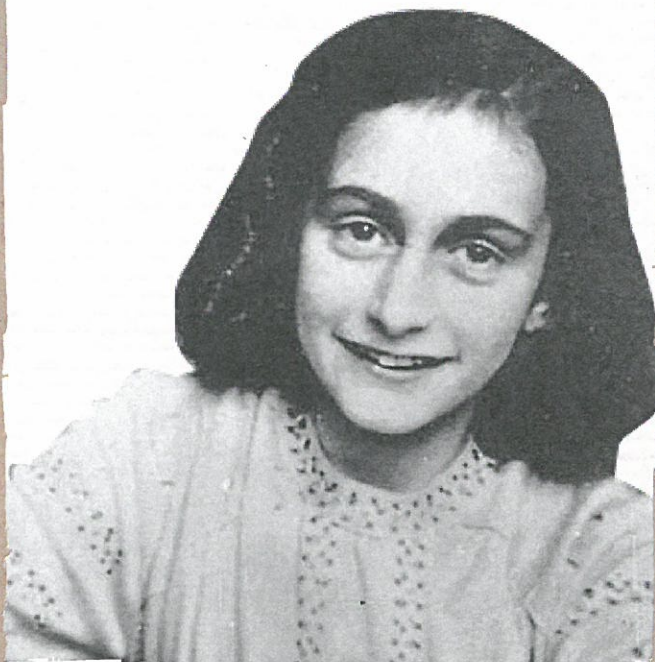

EXHIBIT JANUARY 16 – MARCH 18, 2017

The story of Anne Frank and her family is juxtaposed against world events before, during and after the rise to power of Adolf Hitler and the Nazi party. The exhibition introduces visitors to the events leading up to World War II, and the government directed killing of Jews, Gypsies, the disabled, Slavs and others. The exhibit depicts individuals who chose to join the Nazi party and become perpetrators, those who were bystanders, as well as those who were willing to resist the Nazi tyranny.

The Book Club meets bimonthly to discuss literature related to the history and lessons of the Holocaust and World War II. Join us this month as we reflect on The Diary of Anne Frank.

LECTURE FEBRUARY 12, 2 PM
