Required to train and fight in segregated units, the Tuskegee Airmen are still regarded as some of the most skilled aviators of the war. This exhibit explores the history of the first African-American pilots to fly in combat during World War II.

Presented in collaboration with Opera Orlando and Florida Symphony Youth Orchestra, *Brundibar* is the story of two children, Aninku and Pepicek, who must outwit the town bully in order to buy milk for their sick mother. Completed in 1938, the opera was performed 55 times by the children of the Nazi concentration camp, Terezin.

This performance is part of The Holocaust Center's annual Kristallnacht commemoration. It will be held at the Rosen Jewish Community Center.
